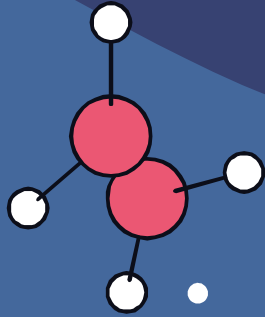

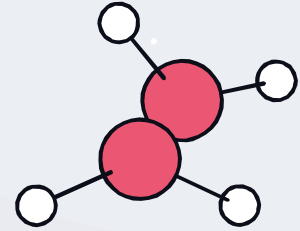

- English learner

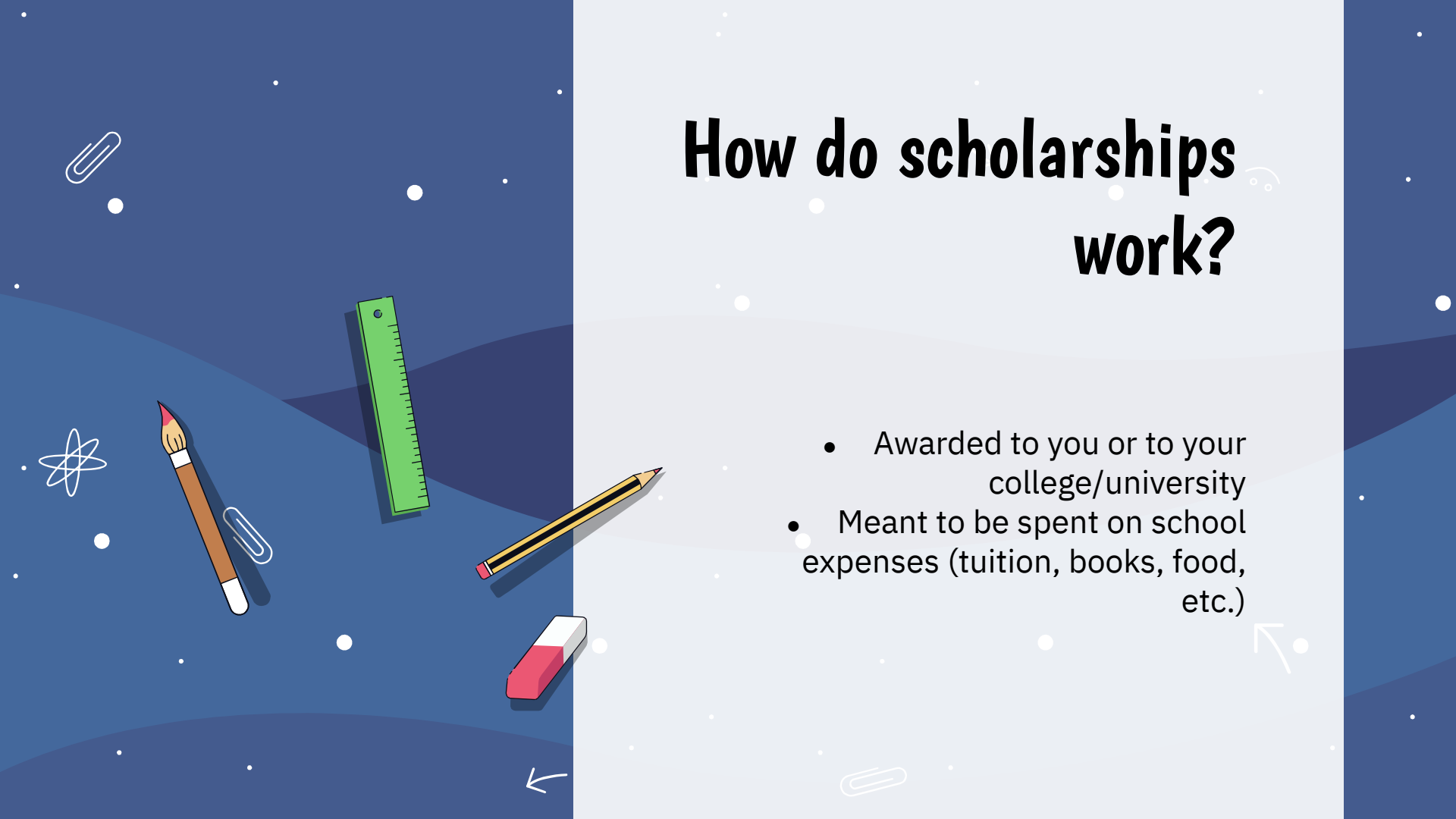
What are scholarships?

- Do not have to be repaid
- One time or renewable
- Institutional or other organizations
- Could have requirements (GPA, essay, volunteer work)



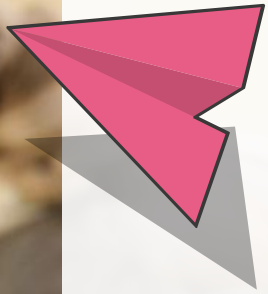
How do scholarships work?

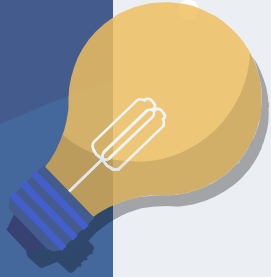
- Awarded to you or to your college/university
